

Oral Presentation & Recommendation Report Evaluation

This entire project is worth 20% of your course grade. The overall grade for the group project is an individual grade. In other words, group members are assessed individually. The members of the group will not necessarily all earn the same grade.

What's goes into the grade	What the grade will be based on
Your group's recommendation report	Based on my reading of the document, according to the general description listed in the grade scale on the course syllabus.
Your group's oral presentation	Based on my observation of your presentation as well as the comments and feedback of others in the class.
Your group's in-class writing	Based on effort, meeting deadlines, and accuracy. If you are not in class on the day work is due, you receive a zero while group members who were present will receive credit.
Your individual participation in the group's work	Based on your attendance, my observation of your work, your self-assessment, and the assessment of the others in your group.

Group Assessment Activity

After all of the presentations, go to the Tests & Quizzes section of Scholar and answer these four questions about the oral presentations to let me know about your work and how your group collaborated.

1. Tell me about the work that you personally did on the project. You can jot the work down in a bulleted list, but be sure to be specific and clear.
2. Assign a percentage to each member of your group, including yourself, to identify the amount each member contributed to the project. For example, if there were three people in your group and you all participated equally, you'd each have done 33.3% of the work.
3. Once you've identified how much work each group member did, assess the work of your collaborators. For each group member, write two or three sentences that explains how well the person collaborated, the positive and/or negative contributions that the person made, and whether you would want to work with the person on a project again. Please be honest. I will not share your responses with anyone else.
4. Finally, reflect on all of the presentations. Assume that your presentation was the best. Which of the remaining presentations did you consider the second best and why? Which did you find most convincing or well-done? Feel free to make comments on other presentations if you wish.
